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Parent Satisfaction Survey Report 2023-24

Introduction:

- 48% are satisfied with the teaching methodologies adopted by the faculty.
- 5. Cultural and Extra Co-curricular Activities:
 - 52% believe their wards get equal opportunities in all types of cultural and extra cocurricular activities.
 - 45% are satisfied with their wards' performance in these activities.
- 6. Infrastructure and Learning Environment:

- 48% agree that the college provides adequate infrastructure and a proper learning environment.
- 52% agree that the college provides a clean and healthy learning environment.

7. Library and Access to Resources:

• 60% confirmed their wards have proper access to the library, books, and journals.

8. Administrative Staff:

• 55% expressed satisfaction with the public dealing of administrative staff.

9. Overall Rating:

• The overall rating of the institution was positive, with 17% rating it as "Excellent" and 50% as "Outstanding."




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


1. Are you asking from your ward about academic activities in the college. 42 responses




Are you satisfied with the performance of your ward in academics?




4. Fairness in the internal evaluation of your ward by the teachers.






Are you satisfied with the teaching methodologies adopted by our teaching faculty.




7. Is your ward getting equal opportunity in all types of cultural and extra co-curricular activities in the college?






9. Do you agree with the statement that our college is providing adequate infrastructure and proper learning environment to all the students? 42 responses




10. Do you agree with the statement that our college is providing clean and healthy learning environment to all the students? 42 responses




11. Is your ward getting proper access of Library, Books and Journal in the college? 42 responses



Since the 2019-20 academic year, gathering feedback from teachers has been a standard practice at the college. However, this process was disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic and resumed in the 2023-24 session. A total of 29 teachers from various programs, including B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., B.B.A., B.C.A., M.A., and M.Com., participated in the survey. All responses were verified and selected by the IQAC team for analysis.

<u>Questionnaire</u>

A questionnaire comprising of 7 questions covering general information of faculty and 13 questions for feedback about students, academic, evaluation process, teaching methodology, extracurricular activities, facilities and infrastructure etc. was prepared. One open ended question for suggestions and improvements has also been included in the survey.

Teachers' Feedback was measured on 5-point scale like Poor to Excellent, Unfair to Always Fair, and Strongly Disagree to Strongly Agree etc. (See Annexure-II).

Positive Aspects of Feedback for Motivation

- ✓ More than 96.6% teachers ensure 90% and above attendance in their classes on regular basis.
- ✓ 93.1% teachers rated themselves excellent in Classroom Communications.
- ✓ 97% of teachers rated themselves good in teaching approach including 62.1% excellent in teaching approach.
- ✓ 96.6% teachers are satisfied with the fairness of internal evaluation process followed for student evaluation.
- ✓ 96.6% teachers are frequently using example and applications for concepts illustration.
- ✓ 75.8% teachers are able to identify their weaknesses and overcome them on regular basis for effective teaching.
- ✓ 79.3% teachers are satisfied with the infrastructure facilities for students including Class rooms, Lecture Hall and Practical Labs.
- Administrative staff of the college is always helpful as 86.2% teachers are satisfied with the administrative services.

- ✓ 100% teachers are satisfied with their students' behaviors in the classes.
- ✓ 79.3% teachers are usually satisfied with their current work load.
- ✓ 82.8% teachers are usually satisfied with the infrastructure facilities provided by the college.
- ✓ 86.2% teachers are satisfied with the library infrastructure facilities including availability of Books, Journals, Magazines and Newspapers etc.
- ✓ 93.1% teachers are satisfactorily using various modes of online teaching.
- ✓ 100% teachers appreciated the proposed initiative of Innovation Lab in College, and were ready to be the part of innovation lab without any remunerative benefits.
- ✓ All the teachers appreciated the proposed initiative of Capacity Building Programme and 96.5% teachers are also ready to be the part of the Capacity Building Programme without any remunerative benefits.
- ✓ 70% teachers use ICT Tools such as Projectors, Multimedia etc. in their regular teaching assignments.
 - ✓ 79.3% teachers are satisfied with Canteen and Cafeteria/ Playground/Toilets and Gym facilities in the college.

Suggestions for Improvement of the college (Including Academics, Library, Infrastructure, Evaluation or any other)

- Cleanliness: Ensure that cleanliness is maintained throughout the college campus, including classrooms and restrooms.

-Entrance Exam: Implement an entrance exam for admissions into the B.Sc. program.

-Academic Improvement: To enhance overall academic performance, it's crucial to maintain a suitable teacher-student ratio and increase the library's book collection to meet current student needs. It's essential that the evaluation results of HPU Annual exams are released on time, ideally by the first week of July.

-Faculty Expansion: Two additional faculty members are needed in the Department of Economics.

-Course Diversification: Diversify course offerings and specializations for students. Invite industry experts for guest lectures and promote collaboration on interdisciplinary projects. Establish partnerships with local businesses to provide students with job skills and opportunities. Additionally, prioritize diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives within the institution.

-Evaluation Process: The evaluation process should be made more rigorous and conducted periodically.

- Mental Health Resources: Enhance mental health resources available to students.

-Computer Lab: Provide a dedicated computer lab for B.Com. students during class hours, as well as proper seating arrangements for M.Com students.

-Canteen Facilities: Ensure the canteen operates regularly.

- Library Management: Improve library capacity and address issues related to book availability for students. Address the low seating capacity in the library's reading room for both teachers and students.


- Smart Classrooms: Additional smart classrooms are required.


- ICT Maintenance: Ensure proper maintenance of ICT tools.


Suggestions for Improvement


- Regular cleaning of labs and classrooms, repair of electric appliances in labs, provision of cafeteria and computer facility in science labs
